St Joseph's Music Group and Choir: After many years of service to the parish, the group have decided to step down from this liturgical role and go into retirement. They have been playing for 30 years here and so have contributed greatly to the liturgical celebrations at Christmas, Easter and throughout the liturgical year. They have served the parish and its priests in contributing to our Masses and services most beautifully. I would like to congratulate them on their retirement after so many years. Please do extend a word of thanks to them for yourself also. We all need to be complimented for the work we do, especially as it is a voluntary role here for the music group.

Christmas Crib: As is a great tradition, the crib will remain in place until the feast of The Presentation of the Lord on 2nd February. Twelve days after this, we begin the season of Lent! Easter is very early this year.

Spiritual Accompaniment: Fr Phillip is available for direction and accompaniment in the spiritual life specialising in prayerfulness, personal faith exploration, overcoming spiritual trials and difficulties. Please do speak to him for advice and an appointment. Please be aware this is not 'counselling in psychiatric/therapeutic methods'.

Offertory Envelopes: The next boxes have been ordered. However, they will not begin until the new financial year in April. There will be two months of no envelopes therefore, as your current box ends on last week of January. Instead, please put your offerings on the collection plate. You do not need to provide envelopes yourselves. The two-month hiatus is to align our boxes with the financial year which runs April- April. This makes Parish auditing and administration run more smoothly.

Christmas Crib and Friends of the Holy Land: This is a charity that supports Christians in the Holy Land. The war in the Holy Land has had devastating effects on the Christians there. 80% of the residents of Bethlehem and 5000 in Jerusalem depend on tourism to survive. I visited the Holy Land last year and saw for myself the effects CV-19 had on the poorest. FHL £70,000 has been given to help Gaza's Christian community and the diocese of Jerusalem. Please do consider giving a gift to the crib offering for these people.

Saints we celebrate this week:

Saint Basil the Great was born around 330 AD. He was outstanding in learning and virtue. He was appointed the bishop of Caesarea in 370 AD. He spoke against the Arian Heresy that was prevalent at the time. Arianism was a heresy that denied that Jesus was both true God and true man - something we now affirm in our Creed. His Rule which he wrote for monasteries is still followed by monks in the Eastern Church today.

St Gregory Nazianzen: was born in 330 AD and a friend of St Basil. In 381 AD he became the bishop of Constantinople (modern day Istanbul, Turkey) which was a major centre for Christianity in the East. He returned to his home at Nazianzen where he died around 390 AD. Along with St Gregory of Nyssa, both Gregory and Basil are known in theology as the Cappadocian Fathers. This is the area in Turkey where they came from.

Most Holy Name of Jesus: was promoted by St Bernadine of Siena to encourage the devotion to the name of Jesus. Jesus means "God Saves": our salvation comes through Christ alone. The monogram of the Holy Name is something we are familiar with. "IHS" which we see in many churches and is the Christogram for Jesus Christ in Greek. One to remember for the pub quiz!
