Fasting & Abstinence in Lent – A guide: Fasting: for those between 16-60 years old. If you are outside this age group, you may wish to fast as a personal decision of faith. If you are ill or have long term conditions, you are not bound by fasting.

Abstinence: from meat or meat substitutes for those over the age of 14. Under this age abstinence in not required. Over 14 years there is no upper limit. Usually Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, or on days you want to choose also. Days of Penance: Ash Wednesday, Good Friday & Fridays of Lent. To make a specific act of sorrow for sins either through extra prayer, fasting or alms giving. Giving something up for Lent: this is a great tradition. We remember Jesus fasting for 40 days in the desert. In return, we give up something small like chocolate etc. Or we could give up our free time to do something for others as an act of charity. The gestures are not meant to be onerous.

Saints we celebrate this week:

St Frances of Rome: was born in 1384. She was married at a young age and had three children. She lived in troubled times and gave all she could to the poor and looked after the sick. She was outstanding in virtue of humility, patience and devotion to the those trapped in poverty. In 1425, she founded the Congregation of Oblates which followed the Rule of St Benedict. She died in 1440.

Saints Perpetua & Felicity: They died in Carthage (North Africa) in 203 AD in the persecutions of faith by the Roman Emperor Septimus Severus. The account of their lives and martyrdoms are from the saints themselves, and also eyewitnesses. **St John of God**: was born in Portugal in 1495. After being a soldier, he devoted his life to the care of the sick and poor. He founded a hospital in Granada, Spain. He founded the Order of Hospitallers of St John of God - based upon Jesus' instruction to St John to offer a home to the Blessed Virgin, after Jesus' death. He died in 1550.
