First Confessions: Saturday 16th March, 10.00 a.m. at St. Joseph's. This celebration of the sacrament will take the form of a penitential service. Fr. Frank Smith from St. Mary & St Michael, Settle will also be administering the sacrament.

Season of Passiontide - within Lent: Beginning with Monday of the fourth week of Lent, the readings concentrate on St John's gospel about Jesus which are particularly striking for Lent. Passiontide is the period before Holy Week. Passiontide signifies the intensification of our preparation for Easter. We see the introduction into the church of purple coverings for crucifixes and statues. This tradition serves to intensify our own spiritual preparations for Holy Week. As Jesus was abandoned and betrayed by his own disciples, we forgo the consolation of the view of a statue or crucifix in church to emulate in some way the final journey of Jesus to the Cross. Only at the service on Good Friday do we glimpse the cross again as we take part in the Passion and veneration of the cross, when we come to adore the Saviour of the world.

Second Collection this week is for Catholic Care. The following week, we will have a parish collection for church flowers for Easter.

First Holy Communion Date Reminder: For all parents and children concerned, First Holy Communion will take place on **Sunday 9**th **June** during the parish Mass. Details to come. If there are any children who are eligible and did not receive their First Confession last year, enrolment forms are available at the back of church. Fasting & Abstinence in Lent – A guide: Fasting: for those between 16-60 years old. If you are outside this age group, you may wish to fast as a personal decision of faith. If you are ill or have long term conditions, you are not bound by fasting. Abstinence: from meat or meat substitutes for those over the age of 14. Under this age abstinence in not required. Over 14 years there is no upper limit. Usually Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, or on days you want to choose also. Days of Penance: Ash Wednesday, Good Friday & Fridays of Lent. To make a specific act of sorrow for sins either through extra prayer, fasting or alms giving. Giving something up for Lent: this is a great tradition. We remember Jesus fasting for 40 days in the desert. In return, we give up something small like chocolate etc. Or we could give up our free time to do something for others as an act of charity. The gestures are not meant to be onerous.
